Justin K.H. Tse, Visiting Assistant Professor in the Asian American Studies Program at Northwestern University and co-editor of *Theological Reflections on the Umbrella Movement*, will examine the phenomenon of post-2008 mass occupy movements in urban centers around the world.

Focusing on Byzantine practices in the Euromaidan protests in Kyiv, the Umbrella Movement in Hong Kong, and Black Lives Matter in the United States, the aim of this talk is to explore what contributions these tactical deployments of Orthodoxy even by those who would not claim to be canonically Orthodox contribute to our understanding of how theology is transformed when it is taken to the streets.
